Most Australians might not have heard of Sydneysider Oliver Hoare - but that all might change in the lead up to the Tokyo Olympics. While Australia has been without a big name in the middle distance stocks for a while, Hoare has started making some noise at the right time ahead of Australian qualifiers for the delayed Games. The 1500m runner was competing at a meet in New York and was in second position heading into the final lap behind Scotland's Jake Wightman. The Aussie then put the foot down and left Wightman and the rest of the competition in his wake by a dominant margin, crossing the stripe in a time of 3:32.35.
